

How to grow roses in pots



Choose a large, deep container with good drainage. Fill it around two-thirds full of potting mix and dig a shallow hole in the centre.



Carefully remove the plant from the pot or packaging. You may need to place the pot on its side and squeeze to slide the plant out.




Gently remove excess soil and any damaged roots.

Loosen the soil around the plant, so the roots can spread out.




Place the plant in the hole and cover with potting mix.





Press the soil firmly as you fill in around the rose, removing any air pockets.

Make sure the bud union (where the plant is grafted onto the roots) is 5cm above the soil surface.



Give your roses a good drink! Saturate the soil and water it whenever the surface is dry. You can also add organic mulch to the top layer to lock in moisture.
